

## About Camberley



### Who Lives in Camberley and what do we do?

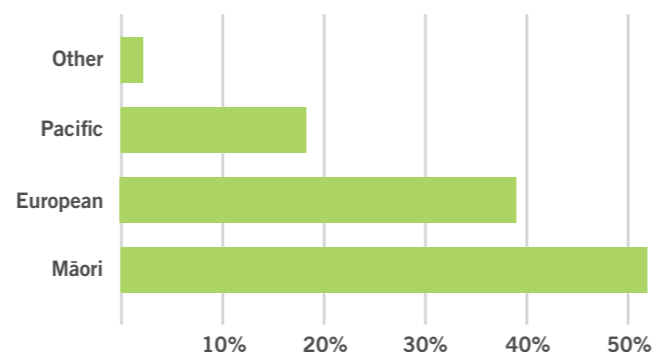
Camberley has more young people than other parts of Hastings, and just over half of the people are Māori. The average (median) age is ten years younger in Camberley (29.3) than in Hastings as a whole (39.6 years old).

Average qualifications and income (and rents) are lower than the Hastings average. This is partly because there are a lot of young people who are yet to get jobs, qualifications and experience and also parents who are still balancing work with looking after their children. When people get more qualifications or experience and are able to work they usually earn more.

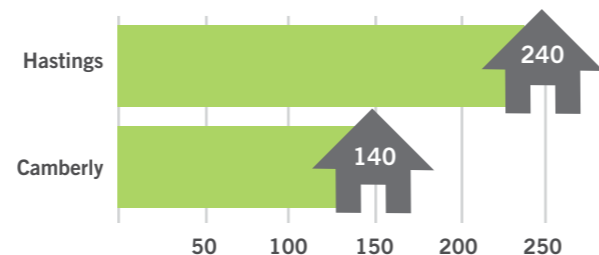
Camberley population: 1881



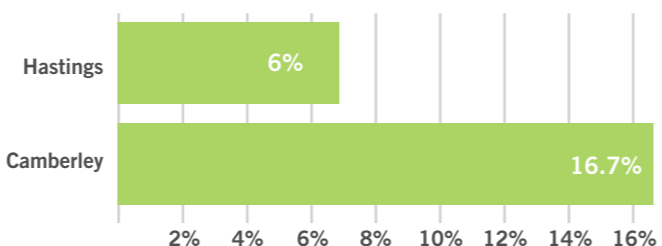
### Ethnic groups in Camberley



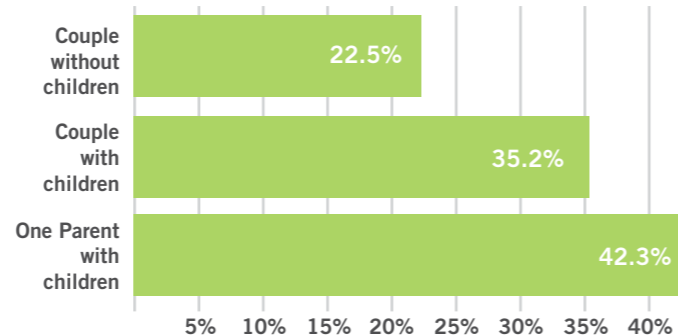
### Median Rent



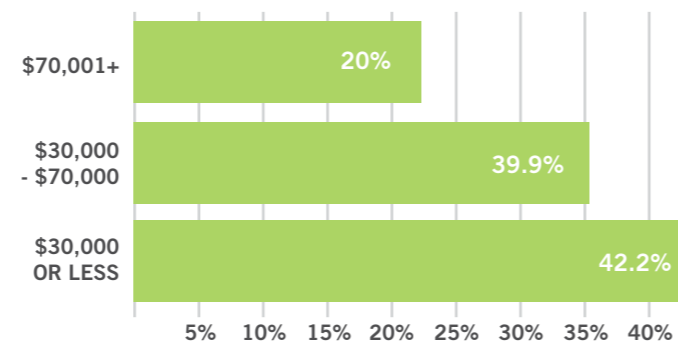
### Unemployment Rate (Age 15+)



### Family Type



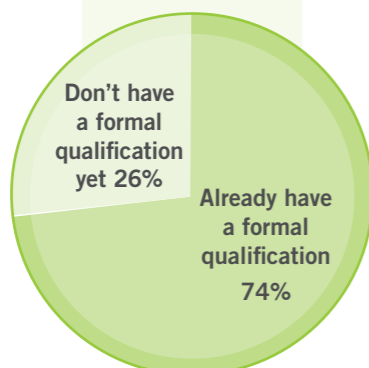
### Household Income



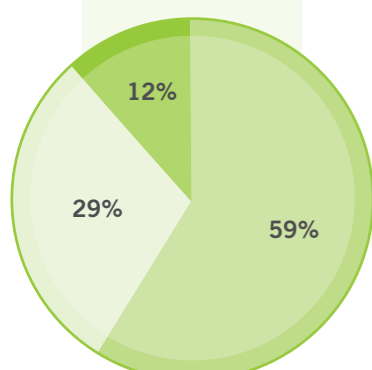
### Qualifications in Camberley

# Camberley Community Plan 2016 - 2020

This plan was developed by community members who came together as C-Focus, who went to events, surveyed and found out what the community wants to help make it happen.

## Feedback Themes

Feedback from the Community for the new plan came in around five themes;

### Upskilling our community

- Employment – employment seminars, EIT courses
- Education and qualifications – drivers licence, homework centre
- Skills – budgeting courses, parenting courses, nutrition (growing and cooking food)

### Increasing participation in our community

- Youth activities – sports, holiday programmes, dancing, music, arts, anti-bullying
- Elderly activities – culture, arts, meals

### Keeping each other safe

- Safety - speed bumps, lighting, neighbourhood support, anti-bullying, increased policing, keeping dogs at home, reduced fighting, supervised children

### Making our community more beautiful

- Beautification – repair houses, street/shops clean up, art, attractive fencing, Pou and positive messages, welcome sign, art work, rubbish collection

### Making the most of the heart of our community – school, park, shops, community centre

- Facilities - Banks/ATM, community gardens, cycleways, strengthen community gathering places (marae concept around park, school, shops, community centre)



## The Camberley community's clear overall community goal:

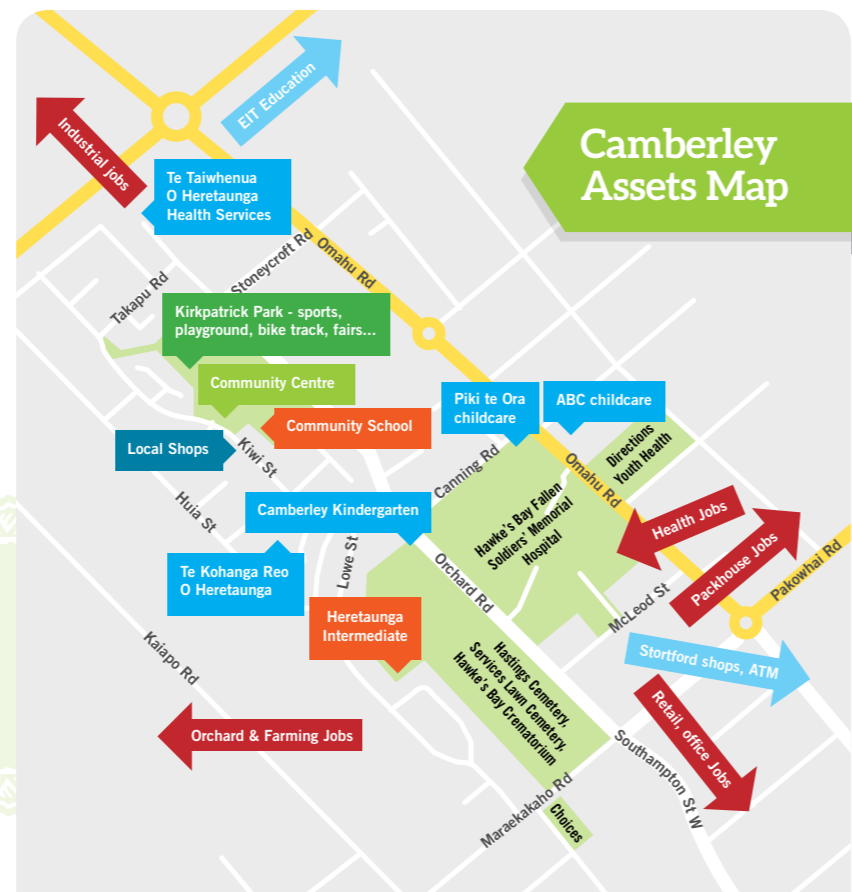

## Background

Camberley has had two previous versions of a community plan which helped see a local community centre built, bus shelters put up, murals painted and activities set up.

The Community Centre, schools, kindergarten and park host many activities, like the Little Tykes programme, Breakfast Club, Cooking classes, Sports days, meetings and family get-togethers.

Annual events include C.A.F.E. (Camberley Annual Festival Event), Camberley versus Maraenui Sports Competition, a senior citizens dinner and Iron Camberley.

Over the last 10 years the community has built on its strengths and now more people are keen to make more good things happen.

### How was this plan developed?

In 2015 Camberley community members identified how they wanted to see things move forward. The clear message was:

*"Let us in the community find out what our people want and lead a community plan."*

Local people stepped up to form the C-Focus community planning team to: ask people what they wanted to happen in Camberley; find out what is most important and what should happen first; put together a plan about

who will do what; and review the plan to make sure it shows what the community wants.

The team got feedback and input from the community through talking at eight meetings or community events, hard copy surveys (nearly 100 were filled in) and an online survey sent by email and posted on social media sites (31 people filled this in).

By 30 November the feedback was collected, organised under themes and prioritised to show the opportunities and activities that the community saw as most important to work on. The draft plan was developed and the community was engaged to confirm their support prior to submission to council.

Lead delivery agents and C-Focus members have put together the Action Plan and who will lead each action, with support from Hastings District Council.

### Kirkpatrick Park Playground

A submission was made to Council's Long Term Plan by Te Ora Hou HB on behalf of the Camberley Community to upgrade the Kirkpatrick Park Playground. Council agreed to allocate a portion of funding to support the upgrade.
