REQUIREMENTS FOR GLASS WASHING AND DISHWASHING MACHINES

- * It shall be fitted with a temperature control device so that it will not operate unless the rinsing water in the rinse water supply tank is at a temperature of not less than 83°C, and the time of exposure to the rinsing water is not less than ten seconds.
- * It shall be equipped with an automatic detergent dosing device.
- * It shall be equipped with baskets, trays or other suitable containers designed and constructed so that all utensils, glasses and jugs can be loaded in such a manner that the surfaces of the utensils, glasses and jugs are subjected to complete wetting during the operation of the machine.
- * It shall be fitted with a thermometer or other efficient measuring device located so as to measure accurately the temperature of the water used for rinsing and situated so that it can be easily and readily observed.
- * The temperature of the washing water is to be not less than 60°C.
