Town and country combine for showtime!

The Hawke's Bay A&P Show returns for its 160th year this month – presenting long-standing popular displays and activities alongside some new additions.

Tickets are on sale now to the iconic event from the Eventfinda website. Those who wish to purchase tickets on the day will need to do so via Eftpos with the removal of cash sales from the ticket office this year. Once inside, attendees will be able to use both cash and Eftpos to make purchases.

In recognition of it being a tough year for many in the region, particularly for those in the primary sector, members of the public can help families affected by Cyclone Gabrielle by sponsoring them for a day out at the show. For a donation of \$55, a family of four will receive entry to the show plus a hot dog and chips each. Sponsorship packages can be purchased at hbap.co.nz, and thanks to Mahons Carnival there will also be complimentary ride tickets for some of the severely impacted families.

Hawke's Bay A&P Society general manager Elisha Milmine said this year's show had a strong focus on community engagement and an emphasis on giving back.

"Alongside this core objective we will see the return of popular agricultural activities, spectator competitions and our highly attended education programme. It really is set to be a three-day extravaganza with something for everyone to enjoy."



There will be a wide variety of competitions on offer this year including design, make and model, pet competitions, dog trials, fencing, shearing, World Cup equestrian class, and many more.

A new addition this year is the community stage where 15-minute slots are open for performances – whether it be dance, kapa haka, choir, music groups or anyone with a talent that they would like to share. People can go to the A&P Society website to lodge expressions of interest to use the stage.

Another new addition to the 2023 line-up is a horticultural section that will showcase what this diverse sector has on offer in Hawke's Bay. It's also a great place to reconnect and chat with industry professionals after what has been a challenging year.

A family favourite, the farmyard area, allows event attendees to get up close and personal with a variety of animals and there's also hundreds of interesting and quality trade exhibits for shopping, an assortment of

carnival amusement rides plus a vintage machinery farming equipment showcase from years gone by.

Further to the spectator competitions and family fun, there is also a selection of corporate networking functions available, including the BWR Agri Business Womens' lunch, ANZ Bank Agri Business Breakfast and the Equestrian lunch. 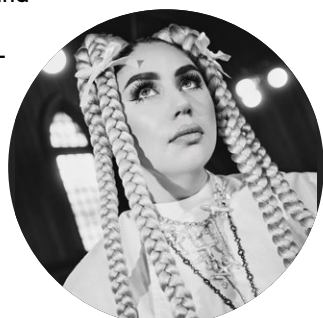

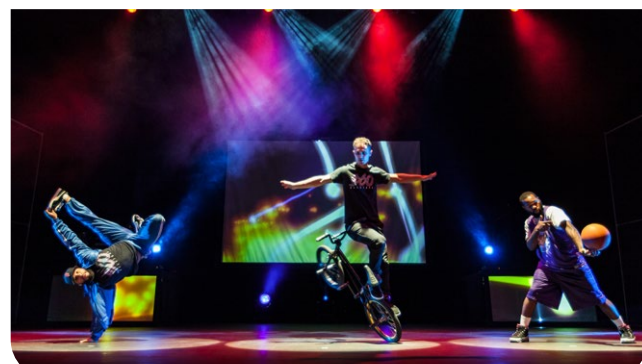

Ko Au: Malosi

From the creators of last year's Festival gem Ko Au, comes Ko Au: Malosi, a powerful collaborative piece created and directed by Seidah Tuoai and Joshua Mitikulena, and featuring Pasifika creatives from Aotearoa, Australia and the USA.

Seidah, a Samoan hip hop dancer who combines street with tradition, has some treats in store for audiences at her show Ko Au: Malosi.

"I've always enjoyed listening to other people's stories. The whole concept of Ko Au: Malosi is to show joy, strength and hope through dance. The dancers performing will all have different versions of what joy is, and what hope means to them, and I'm looking forward to extracting that when we workshop the show's choreography."

A unique fusion of dance, music and spoken word, Ko au: Malosi is a reflection of Seidah's own identity, deeply connected to her cultural heritage, and will explore the themes of inner strength and resilience.

It'll be the first time Seidah's original dance form, 'Popping Pulatasi,' is performed as part of a live, full length show. A combination of street dance and traditional Suva Samoa, the movement tells her story of acceptance and cultural identity.

"For me, Ko au: Malosi is more than dance; it's a showcase of memories and emotions. The show is a live installation work, structured like a church service, performed in St Matthews Church." The white costumes that will be worn by the dancers connect to the Samoan tradition of White Sunday, a core childhood memory for Seidah.

"Hawke's Bay has gone through something big this year and our aim is to connect the members of the audience back to their own joy and purpose, whether that be through the dance, the words, the music, or through seeing the beauty of St Matthews."
