FRUIT BINS CLEANED FOR REUSE

An initiative to clean silt-covered wooden apple bins has achieved some great results. An impressive 20,000 apple bins have been cleaned and sanitised to regulatory standards, then returned to growers. Around 30,000 apple bins were caught in flood waters during Cyclone Gabrielle and strewn across the landscape.

The bin sanitisation programme has saved growers money and enabled them to get enough bins for this year's harvest. The Evergreen Foundation provided \$100,000 to set up the programme, with additional support from Ministry of Social Development and the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment.

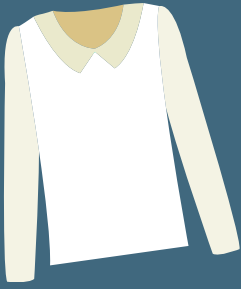

EVENT RECYCLING WIN

Congratulations to Te Piringa Manatapu Māori Wardens for their amazing recycling efforts at the recent Kia Rite Hauora Expo. The health and wellness event collected 480L of recyclables that would have otherwise gone to landfill. That's the same as four kerbside wheelie bins' worth.

Getting good recycling results at events requires a bit of extra effort. The team had a dedicated person stationed at the bins during the event, to help attendees choose the correct bin. They also checked inside the bins regularly and took out incorrect items. Thanks Te Piringa Manatapu Māori Wardens, for showing how effective event recycling can be with the right steps in place.

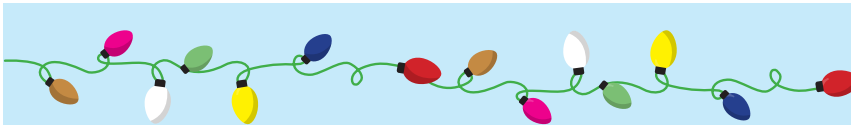

COLLECTION DAYS FOR THE CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS

There will be changes to kerbside recycling and rubbish collection days over the summer holiday period. Your recycling and rubbish collections will be one day later than normal, for two weeks. For example, if your recycling is normally collected on Monday and your rubbish on Tuesday, it would change to: recycling on Tuesday, rubbish on Wednesday.

Normal service days return from Monday 8 January 2024.
