- Waste less, pay less. Households that put out their wheelie bin fortnightly or less can pay less for the service. Visit your council's website for more information.

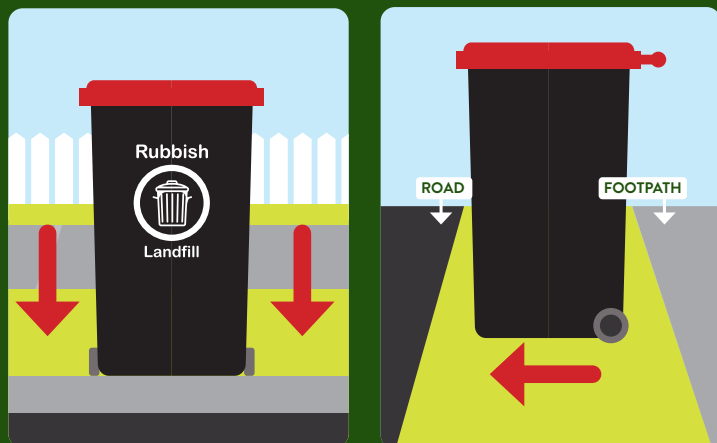

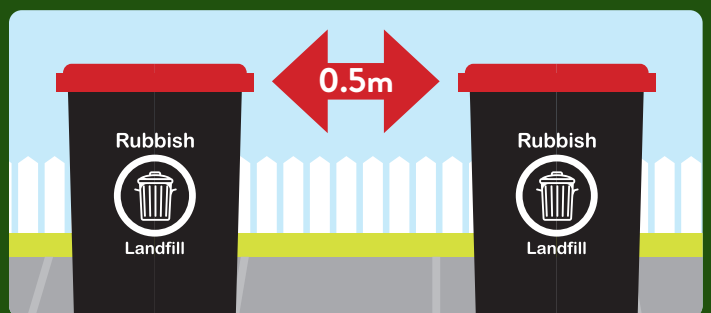
